THE FUTURE FOR SKI CLUB BUS TRIPS What have we found out?

Surveys including the questions below were sent out to 268 members of the NMCCSC via Survey Monkey. The window to complete surveys was 4/22/20-5/18/20. There were a total of 89 surveys returned on Survey Monkey and 2 additional surveys returned by e-mail. Responses were bimodal with most returned a few days after the survey went out and another peak of responses after a group e-mail reminder in May. Some questions were skipped, so totals do not necessarily add up to the 91 surveys returned. Other questions elicited multiple responses, in which case, the number may exceed 91.

1. Have you been on a bus trip? Yes/No

The majority of respondents (62) had been on a bus trip, while 29 had not. People who had not been on a bus trip may have chosen to not complete the survey since I had many questions about this.

2. Which bus trips have been your favorite?

Some folks had only been on one bus trip, while others had been on multiple trips. Many people indicated more than one favorite. All responses were tabulated. Votes for each location mentioned:

- It was interesting how Pagosa bus trip didn't fill up last year but there was still a smaller group (half the size?) that enjoyed going as a carpool trip which worked out well. Would like more of the carpool trips if thats possible, at least to closer locations like Pagosa, Chama & Red River.
- I would just note that I signed up for the Pagosa trip that didn't succeed to fill for a bus trip but got turned into a car trip instead. I had a great time and thought it was a success. Since Pagosa Springs is closer it didn't feel like it was as burdensome of a drive. Representative quotes:

• I think bus trips are great for some people. I think that the club should focus more on the local ski scene. Develop dialog and partnerships with like minded groups such as snowshoers(they are here to stay) and Sandia Nordic(regularly maintained cross country ski trails) An unrelated subject-Nothing against the Garden Center, but community centers offer the same or better meeting facilities at no cost.

- I filled out an eval after the CB trip. To reiterate, costs could be cut by not so much communal junk food as bus snacks. Perhaps this current crisis has allowed folks to reexamine the environmental impacts of buying corporate factory farmed food from big box stores. (soda pop, candy, etc) Being new, I was shocked and dismayed. Otherwise, I loved the place, the company, concern for safety and great conditions. Thank you.
- I hope we can get enough people to sign up if we have just one bus trip per year and make an effort to arrange at least one car trip to 'nearby' towns such as Pagosa (as we did this year), Chama, Durango, Silverton
- Could there be an option that the cost of the trip might go up if the bus didn't fill (to a certain limit)? This would reduce the risk of having to get to a certain target of participants for the trip to proceed. It would make it easier to plan such as for taking off work (similar to the above idea to turn bus trips to car trips if not enough people sign up). I have only been in the club for the prior year and my wife and I really have enjoyed a chance to meet other skiers and the multi day trips are so great for this. Thanks for all the leaders and organizers for all they do!
- We've been lucky to have outstanding Bus Trip Chairs, it's a huge under taking, and excellent trail leaders. Maybe split up the responsibilities more
