On Thursday March 30, ten FOSM volunteers joined SRD Trails Foreman Joseph Jaffa-Martinez, SRD Trail Crew member Jeff Cervantes, and SW Region Trails(etc.) Manager Kerry Wood for some tread maintenance on the South Crest Trail north of Canyon Estates, not far below Travertine Falls. Tasks included removing old rock waterbars which were no longer working; removing rocks lining the outside edge, to allow water to move off the trail; building several check-steps (and repairing one); building 2 drain dips; removing debris from existing drain-dips; building a short reroute around a trenched-out section; and re-benching a section of tread which had become excessively outsloped. The main event was building the checksteps, which involved finding and moving large rocks (sometimes long distances), digging trenches to secure them in place, and back-filling with smaller rocks and soil. Unlike a waterbar, the purpose of a check-step is less about moving water off the trail than about slowing it down, allowing soil to collect behind the check-step rather than washing away down the trail, thus preventing erosion in the long run. A well-made check-step will also hold up to user traffic (including equine) over time. The crew discovered that building a "well-made check-step" often involves several attempts and iterations to get it right! We were lucky to have Kerry and Joseph there to provide expert guidance; everyone learned a lot over the course of the day. Conditions were excellent for working: nice temps, sheltered from the wind on a strong-wind day, no mud or snow.
