Report of FOSM Project to Split Rounds in Cienega Picnic Area from Trees Felled During Chain Saw Recertification Wednesday, March 13, 2024

FOSM members used Lou Romero's vintage log splitter to process rounds previously bucked in the Cienega Picnic Area in preparation for donating to the Mountain Christian Church Wood Ministry. Wood consisted of ponderosa pine, white fir, and Rocky Mountain juniper. Most of the rounds came from trees felled earlier this year during chainsaw recertification by the Forest Service of FOSM and FS sawyers and bucked over the past several weeks by FOSM volunteers.

The work took place in three areas:

- Upper (west) parking lot Hauling and splitting rounds from a large, still-green, white fir tree felled during the recertification exercise as well as a small Rocky Mountain juniper tree.
- Group Picnic Area Further splitting 26 quarter-rounds from a 23-inch ponderosa pine bucked and hand split in previous weeks.
- Acequia Trail and lower (east) parking lot Hauling and splitting rounds from ponderosa pine trees (mostly) felled during the recertification exercise and bucked in previous weeks.

The eleven FOSM volunteers worked in two crews led by Dan Benton and Lou Romero:

- Hauling Betsy Galloway, Jerry Carroll, Eric Russell, Mike Madden, and Dan Benton.
- Splitting Rene Archer, Joelle Hertel, Lou Romero, Don Carnicom, Steve Roholt, and Cliff Giles.

The last rounds were split in a light pelting of snow; however, the forecasted high winds had not appeared by the time we finished at approximately 12:30.

From 80 to 90 rounds remain to be processed in future weeks. Hauling the split wood to the church parking lot will begin next Wednesday if Lou succeeds in obtaining Forest Service wood hauling permits in time.


