

The upper end of this new loop will tie into the fall-line user trail right here.



Get er' done! Starting to cut in the new line.



The crew is hard at it on the reroute. The soil is still almost muddy in places.



The upper connection of the loop is cut back into the user trail and the fall line section is obliterated.



Meanwhile, at the rock outcrop. What! I'm not getting paid to crush rock? Hey you, keep working!



Ok, let's figure out how to fit this last big one into the puzzle.



The rock crushers get with it, the dirt crew finds dirt, and the chain gang boss keeps an eye on things.



After a \underline{lot} of rock backfill and a \underline{lot} of rock crushing, the top layer of soil comes in and gets tamped.



Boom, done! The crew completed a very nice section up the rock outcrop.



Above the rock outcrop, the boss looks for the best line. Turns are really tough to design!



With the final line selected, the crew cuts in the turn and finishes the section.



Always slow getting started after lunch but then the crew gets after another loop in the trail.



Turns in the trail are just hard to cut in. Not too steep, keep a nice line, ensure drainage.



Whoa! Dynamite crew today! I didn't think we would get to and finish a second loop in the trail.



We found a massive axe-cut tripod oak stump, over six feet tall. Glad we didn't need to dig this out!



This week it was the lupine's turn to start blossoming on the mountain.
