FOSM Trail Session Report for 11/7/19

The Friends of the Sandia Mountains (FOSM) trail crew continued working on Cienega/Armijo Trail Improvement Project (CATIP) reroutes. After a wet weather front moved through the area, a very thick fog sat like a blanket at around 7,000 feet all day long. It was chilly but no wind at all. There were a few sections of muddy trail, especially in the morning but nothing too bad. No dust today!

The crew continued extending the last section of Deer Bed Trail downhill towards the start of Vista Trail, completing approximately 450 feet of new trail or 0.09 mile. Maybe a quarter mile left of trail building to go? It remains to be seen if the fall weather lets us finish this reroute.
