FOSM Special Project Report for 3/9/20

Spring is coming! The Friends of the Sandia Mountains (FOSM) were able to squeeze in another work day between weather systems on the Cienega/Armijo Trail Improvement Project (CATIP).

The small crew of volunteers led by Russell Berman, Sandia Ranger District Trails Foreman, included Phil Cromer, Don Carnicom, Bruce Hansche, Steve Roholt, and Betsy and Bob Galloway.

A great day to be out on the trails: full sun, slight breeze, and not too much mud. The crew installed a total of nine signs procured through a grant from REI. There are four more trail signs pre-positioned out on CATIP for later installation.

The first seven holes before lunch were easy, with deep winter infiltration loosening the clay. We expected the same on the last two holes but spent a lot of time fighting rocks in a different area of CATIP. Unfortunately, with the start of goshawk nesting season, we cannot use the power auger until September 1. But the wet soil made most of the digging relatively easy.
